

What will I need to rent the SR20?

Pilots desiring to rent the SR20 are required to complete the Cirrus rental training course. This course is not designated as an Insurance Transition Course. The course is comprised of a seven flight and ground lesson syllabus and is completed at different paces depending upon pilot experience. Using the matrix below, one can calculate how many hours it will take to complete the course:



If Pilot flight experience includes:	Plan for:
500+ hours Total Time (with at least 100 hours in previous 12 mos.) 50+ hours high performance Experience with Avidyne Integra (PFD/MFD) and Garmin 430GPS Instrument rated, instrument current and proficient	8-10 hours
200 - 500 hours Total Time 25 - 50 hours high performance Instrument rated, current and proficient OR experienced with advanced avionics and GPS	10 hours
Less than 200 hours Total Time Less than 25 hours High Performance No instrument rating or experience with advanced avionics or GPS	10 + hours

To rent the SR22, an instrument rating is required as well as completion of the Cirrus Rental Training Course. This can be accomplished in the SR22 and the full motion Cirrus sim if one so desires. If you have previous SR20/SR22 time, use the Matrix below to determine the number of hours required to complete the course/transition flight.
